

Problem-Based Learning

- Student Centered
- ✓ Occurs in Small Groups
- Teacher as Facilitator
- Problems are Introduced Early
- Problems Stimulate Problem-Solving Skills
- New Knowledge is Obtained



III-Structured Problems

- V Do Not Provide the "Right" Answer
- Open-Ended & Complex
- ✓ Mirrors Real-World
- Requires Collaboration
- Evolves with New Information
- Spark Interest/Controversy
- Engages Questions



Peer-Peer Learning

Increases knowledge retention by turning passive, note-taking students into *active, de facto teachers* who explain their ideas to each other.


Culture:

Mindset:

A pattern of **basic assumptions** learned by an individual as he/she solved problems of **external adaptation** and **internal integration** that has worked well enough to be considered valid, and therefore assumed to be the **correct way to perceive, think, and feel** in relation to those problems.
